Greeting from the Chairman – Richard Holland MBE

In 1998 I became Chairman of the Barbara Bus Fund having served as a Trustee for 2 years. At this time the Fund's first employee, Coordinator Julia Pryor, worked from home whilst the vehicles remained based at the RNOH.

Over the years I have seen many changes in Charity regulations, but the bigger change has been the increase in demand for the services of the Barbara Bus Fund. Although the Fund carries out many journeys for non-medical reasons, the number of medical appointments that vehicles are used for continues to grow. Passengers tell us that they would be unable to get to important medical appointments without the unique service the Fund provides.

We made a conscious decision as Trustees in recent years to expand the fleet size and also have vehicles strategically placed across the UK, enabling as many people as possible to access our services both within hospitals and the local community. As a result, in addition to an increased fleet size at our Head Office at the RNOH where the majority of vehicles are based, we now have satellite operations in Wales, Yorkshire, Sheffield and Buckinghamshire.

It is evident that my Aunt, Barbara, had incredible foresight and with the support of many people started the Barbara



Bus Fund. Initially Barbara wanted to help fellow patients to get out of the hospital and visit family and friends for social events and trips. If she could see now how the Fund is supporting so many people in the many different ways it does, she would be so happy. The Fund has developed and expanded over the years whilst maintaining the original ethos. Thank you to everyone who supports the Fund and makes it all happen.

News from the National Spinal Injuries Unit at Stoke Mandeville Hospital: The first satellite branch to be opened by the Barbara Bus Fund in August 2006, "BARBARA" is the bus based at Stoke Mandeville hospital and is available for use by inpatients. BARBARA is a Vauxhall Vivaro adapted to carry 2 wheelchairs, 4 passengers plus the driver. One of our passengers Charlotte Simcock has been piloting a new scheme with Dogs for Good where a dog, in this case 'Danny',

island of Anglesey, the better to serve residents in the northern areas of Wales. We are currently researching the options for a suitable secure, readily accessible base for the vehicle. A local regular user of the Welsh vehicles has expressed enthusiasm for helping to set up this new branch and we look forward to expanding the work of the Barbara Bus Fund as soon as possible. The current three vehicles are based around the local community in Gwynedd.

News from Peter at The Spinal Unit Recreational Fund (SURF) at Pinderfields Hospital, Wakefield: The Barbara Bus Fund took over ownership and management of the vehicle "ALEX" and opened its third satellite branch in November 2010. "ALEX" is a Citroen

Dispatch converted to carry one wheelchair, 5 passengers plus the driver. The vehicle was generously donated to SURF by the family of an ex patient who had died. SURF was unable to operate the vehicle so approached BBF and here we are, 7 years on and still able to provide invaluable transport for passengers in the Spinal Injuries Rehab Unit and Regional Spinal Injuries Centre. We are enormously grateful to Peter Hanley for his continued dedication and support in looking after this branch.

BILL is a new Ford Tourneo Connect, the same specification as our new Fords at Stanmore and is available for use by inpatients. It is named after Bill Seaton, one of the first volunteer drivers and good friend of Barbara.

Fundraising

We are enormously grateful to the RAF Physical Training Instructors and colleagues for completing their 'Row for Rob' challenge. Each RAF base taking part rowed a total of 210,116 kilometres. Corporal Robert Bugden was injured during a parachute training exercise in the US on 21.01.16, which is where the idea for the distance of the row came from. Having set a massive target of £32,000, in March and April they dug deep and raised a staggering £34,590 108% of their £32,000 target, an outstanding achievement. Funds were raised to support a new wheelchair accessible vehicle to be based at Barbara Bus Fund Head Office at the Royal National Orthopaedic Hospital, Stanmore.
